

Personal Care Attendant

The Medical Department also provides Personal Care Attendant services by offering:

- Coordination of initial assessment with a county Public Health Nurse to determine eligibility for Personal Care Attendant Services.
- In-Home assistance to help promote maximum independence in daily living skills and hygiene needs.
- Plan of Care is based on individual needs and periodic supervision of the Personal Care Attendant by a Registered Nurse.

Cultural Competency Training

Cultural Competency Training is offered to professionals to increase their skills in providing culturally appropriate services to diverse populations. The training team offers individual and organizational training to create a climate where multicultural perspectives and relationships can develop and responsive care can take place. Topics include:

- Communication
- Demographic Data
- Ethical/Legal Cultural Educational Base

Youth Leadership

The Youth Leadership workshop series provides education and training about the criminal justice system. Workshops focus on the enhancement of youth who have a developmental disability. Designed to reduce the under representation of children of color in the juvenile justice system, workshops explore:

- Criminal justice
- Anger management
- Social skills
- Academic tutoring

Residential Care Program

Residential services are offered to young adults (19 to 30) years old who have developmental disabilities. Young adults who have displayed challenging, emotional and/or aggressive behavior learn how to regulate their behavior and improve their social skills. Our staff provides instruction, training and support which is designed to increase residents' independence and increase their participation in the community.
