About the Program

Our Residential Care Program provides a setting where young adults who have developmental disabilities and mental health disorders can develop independent living and community integration skills.

Young adults who have displayed challenging, emotional and/or aggressive behavior learn how to regulate their behavior and improve their social skills. IMD staff provides instruction, training and support which is aimed at increasing residents' cultural competency, independence and community participation.

Residents learn the value of:

- Family and extended family responsibilities
- Relationships within the community
- Independence
- Collective responsibility

About the Staff

The IMD residential care team is comprised of professionals who are uniquely equipped to address the issues presented by our residents.

Our QMRP Behavioral Specialist develops and directs residents' behavioral programming, crisis intervention and daily routine. The Program

Manager develops and coordinates services in the areas of health, counseling, psychiatric, nursing, leisure, recreation and community programming. Program implementers provide direct service including resident supervision, goal implementation and recreation and leisure.

Services Provided

The program's goal is to provide a residential setting in which individuals can learn and practice the skills they need to live independently.

Residents receive instruction and support in developing daily life skills such as:

- Shopping
- Meal planning
- Money management
- Appropriate social behavior
- Recreation
- Social service
- Transportation
